Definition: Legend Drug

- A Legend Drug is any drug, injection, powder, ointment, IV, vaccine, tablet, capsule, or in any other delivery form that includes the following on the label:
 - The Words: Caution: Federal Law Prohibits Dispensing Without A Prescription,

Or

- The Words: RX ONLY

Definition of Dispensing

 Definition of Dispensing 680-X-2-C: To sell, distribute, administer, leave with, give away, dispose of, deliver, or supply a drug or medicine to the ultimate user or their agent

Alabama State Nurse Dispensing Law

Alabama Code: 1975 § 34-23-11b

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State Nurse Dispensing Law

 (b) A registered nurse in the employment of the State Health Department or a county health department may, in the provision of health care services, dispense legend drugs as provided in this section under the standing orders...

State Nurse Dispensing Law (con't)

... or direct supervision of a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state and pursuant to procedures established by the Board of Pharmacy and implemented by a pharmacist licensed to practice pharmacy in this state.

State Nurse Dispensing Law (con't)

 The nurse may dispense the legend drugs for the treatment of tuberculosis, sexually transmitted diseases, family planning, hypertension, and other programs if approved by the State Board of Pharmacy (meningitis & pertusis)

State Nurse Dispensing Law (con't)

- The dispensing of the drugs shall meet all labeling, packaging, recordkeeping and counseling requirements of a prescription
- The Board of Pharmacy shall have the responsibility to inspect the site where the dispensing occurs

State Nurse Dispensing Law (con't)

 The authority granted to a registered nurse pursuant to this subsection shall not apply to controlled substances as defined in Chapter 2 of Title 20

Counseling Provisions

- Counseling on the drug(s) as opposed to lifestyle or the condition
- Counseling according to set standards (About The Drug)
 - OBRA 90- Medicaid
 - Public Law 104-180 Counseling Guidance
 - FDA Counseling Guidance

OBRA 90

- Public law
- Set standards for counseling on drugs
- Primarily for pharmacists and Medicaid
- · Applies to all dispensers
- Sets standards for drug utilization review
- Liability created

Synopsis of Counseling Provisions

- Counseling should be oral and written on all new prescriptions
- · ADPH nurses included in state law

Elements of Written Counseling Summarized & Included On PILS

- · What is the medicine?
 - -Give uses, indications
- What should I tell my Health Care Provider before I take this medicine?
 - -List conditions

Elements of Written Counseling Summarized On PILS (con't)

- · How should the medicine be taken?
 - -Give directions Rx What to do if a dose is missed?
- · What may interact with this medicine?
 - -List drugs that interact both OTC

Elements of Written Counseling Summarized On PILS (con't)

- What side effects may occur?
 - List side effects and what to do about them

Elements of Written Counseling Summarized On PILS (con't)

- Side effects statement verbatim: Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. You may report side effects to the FDA at 1-800-FDA-1088 (this is new starting on Jan. 1, 2009)
 - -Delayed for 6 Months

Elements of Written Counseling Summarized On PILS (con't)

- What should I watch for while taking this medication?
 - List special items pursuant to this drug (see example isoniazid PIL)
- · How do I store the medication?

Liability

- Law is clear about provision of written and oral counseling and standards are set
- Liability is created if patient not counseled and has health problem as a result
- Providing PILS is one way to lessen liability

Steps To Legal Dispensing

- Similar to nurses right of medication administration
- Provide the correct medication,
- · Properly labeled,
- To the correct patient
- Along with the required standardized drug information either orally, in writing or both
