The H1N1 influenza virus continues to spread across Alabama and the southeast. More than two thousand people in Alabama have been infected to date. At this time, H1N1 is the dominant influenza strain with 99% of cases testing positive for it. As people continue to gather in large groups at churches, schools, and sporting events, the virus will only continue to spread, even with prevention measures in place. Local hospitals will be called on to treat ill patients, but the question is, will there be enough beds for everyone? This program will discuss this and some of the other upcoming challenges Alabama hospitals face with the H1N1 influenza virus outbreak, and how to overcome them.
