Alabama Child Caring Program

It was announced that the Alabama Child Caring Program will be phasing out. The final date of operation will be December 31, 2010. Barbara Hutchinson stated that the expansion of ALL Kids in October of 2009 as well as health care reform legislation has made the program reassess its role. A press release was distributed on June 11th and there was an article in the Birmingham News as well as a report on one of the local television stations.

Donations received by the Program after May 1st are being returned to donors. It was also noted that letters to donors explaining the end of the program were sent out on June 11th. Blue Cross Blue Shield of Alabama has noted they will cover claims costs through December 31, 2010. Barbara stated that they anticipate the claims costs for children to exceed revenue; however, Blue Cross will cover the costs.

Health Information Exchange

Kim Davis-Allen of Alabama Medicaid presented information about the Health Information Exchange project that is being developed. She noted this is an effort to develop a system where health information can be exchanged between providers for all Alabama citizens. She noted that currently there is limited access to comprehensive records and that exchange between providers is episodic. This system would provide true clinic information on patients that will follow the patient as they go through system and are treated by various providers

It was noted that monies are available at the federal level through health care reform legislation to help develop this system. Additionally, there are monies available to use as incentives for providers to use the system. There was some discussion about various aspect of the program.
