

### *The Ryan White Grantee*

The Family Clinic provides services under the Health Resource and Services Administration Alabama Ryan White Part D Program. Part D of the Ryan White CARE Act funds healthcare and services for infants, children, adolescents, and women affected by HIV/AIDS.

### *Clinics*

The Family Clinic conducts clinics each week to serve specific client populations. Members of the medical staff for each population, as well as research personnel, are present or available at each clinic session.

The Family Clinic, located at Children's of Alabama, is dedicated to addressing the needs of HIV/AIDS-infected individuals and their affected families through coordinated medical and psycho-social care.

The Family Clinic strives to provide compassionate, comprehensive, coordinated, and multidisciplinary care through access to primary health care with population-specific providers, pediatric clinical trials and research, and family and community education.

### *Our Mission*

Our mission is to provide the most advanced medical care and comprehensive supportive care to HIV-infected clients and their affected family members.

### *Our Staff*

Our staff includes physicians specializing in pediatrics, adolescent medicine, women's health, and HIV/AIDS. Additionally, we have social workers, nurses, psychologists, dieticians, pharmacists, and advocates who provide excellent care and services that are tailored to each individual client and their family.

#### Our clinical services include:

- Medical management

#### Our supportive services include:

- Counseling of HIV-infected pregnant women about infection risk to their children
- Consumer and parent comprehensive education about HIV transmission and its complications
- Evaluation of Medicaid eligibility of clients and their families
- Linkage to community resources

The Clinic also coordinates with other agencies to provide necessary services such as housing, substance abuse services, credit counseling, adult mental health resources, and other basic needs for our clients.

#### Prenatal and Postpartum Care

Family Clinic provides a full range of medical services for women during pregnancy and childbirth, postpartum and for exposed infants. During pregnancy patients are closely monitored by our nurse practitioner who is a specialist in the field of HIV, prenatal care. Obstetrical care is provided to the expectant mother throughout the pregnancy and HIV related care is provided for the exposed but not determined HIV positive baby for the first eighteen months of the baby's life. The nurse practitioner, along with other members of the multidisciplinary team's goal is to help patients achieve a healthy pregnancy and delivery.

#### Prevention and Outreach

Family Clinic offers free and confidential rapid (20 Minutes) HIV testing, education and counseling. Our services are provided in a supportive, non-judgmental environment to assist you in identifying your HIV risks and risks for other sexually transmitted infections. An individual can be tested as a walk-in or by appointment.

HIV/AIDS community outreach is performed through health fairs, screenings and testing at specific locations and community events. HIV/AIDS education is also performed for individuals and groups seeking knowledge of the disease.
