

Program Summary and Eligibility Criteria Effective July 1, 2012

Early Detection

What is the Alabama Breast & Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program?

It is an Alabama Department of Public Health program that provides FREE breast and cervical cancer screenings for women who are eligible. This is a federally funded program.

Who is eligible to receive free breast and cervical cancer screenings?

- Women age 40 to 64
- Without insurance or who are underinsured
- Income is at or below 200% of the poverty level

What are the free screening services?

- Annual Pelvic Exam and Pap smear as indicated
- Annual Clinical Breast Exam
- Annual Mammogram
- Diagnostic Tests, if the breast/cervical cancer screening tests come back abnormal

What if I am diagnosed with cancer?

• You will be automatically referred to Medicaid for treatment of breast or cervical cancer

How do I enroll in the program?

- Call 1-877-252-3324 to find out if you may be eligible
- You will be referred to a physician that has agreed to participate in the program
- Make an appointment with the physician. He will confirm that you are eligible and enroll you in the program

Treatment

What is the Alabama Breast & Cervical Cancer Treatment Program?

It is an Alabama Department of Public Health program that provides free treatment through Medicaid for eligible women who have been diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer.

Who is eligible to receive free treatment for breast and cervical cancer?

- Women
- Diagnosis of breast or cervical cancer
- Under age 65
- Have no insurance or who are underinsured
- Income is at or below 200% of the poverty level

What if I have already started treatment for breast or cervical cancer?

- Even if you are already undergoing treatment, you are eligible for treatment through Medicaid
- You must meet eligibility criteria

How do I enroll in the program?

- Ask your physician to call the program at 334-206-5582
- Your physician will send us a form with your contact information and your medical records
- The program will confirm that you are eligible and refer you to Medicaid for treatment
- You will receive a Medicaid application to complete
