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Survivors of Suicide Day offers support for survivors FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

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The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention will sponsor its 10th annual National Survivors of Suicide Day on Saturday, Nov. 22, to reach out to the thousands of people who have lost a loved one to suicide. Alabama conferences in the Birmingham area and in Robertsdale are sponsored by the Alabama Suicide Prevention Task Force. In addition, two additional conferences will be held for survivors of suicide: Nov. 22 in Opelika and Dec. 2 in Florence.

The program will include a recorded 90-minute national conference presentation which will feature a panel of experienced survivors and mental health professionals. This portion of the conference will offer emotional support and information about resources for healing following the loss of a loved one to suicide. This will be followed by an optional discussion period for those who wish to share their experiences with others to help survivors heal.

"Suicide can become a tragedy for anyone it touches. It is not restricted to one age group, cultural group or to any socioeconomic status," said Dollie Hambrick, co-chair of the Alabama Suicide Prevention Task Force, an organization formed in 2001 to address this significant public health problem.

Alabama's suicide rate is 12.7 per 100,000, the highest rate since 2000, according to the health department's Center for Health Statistics. The most recent available rate for the United States as a whole is the 2005 rate of 11.0.

"We hope this day of remembrance will provide survivors a unique way to connect with others who have survived the tragedy of suicide loss," Ms. Hambrick said.
